EMT-B Continuing Education An Internet-Connected Training Program

The Maryland Fire and Rescue Institute (MFRI) is pleased to announce the offering of a new on-line learning course, produced by National Paramedic Institute that provides EMT-B students with an opportunity to complete the 12-hour continuing education requirements for recertification in an on-line learning format.

Course Description: This course includes eight study modules that provide continuing education in medical assessment and trauma care. Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to perform all the roles and responsibilities of the EMT-B required for the emergency care of medical and trauma patients including assessing the patient, managing the airway, recognizing signs and symptoms, and providing care for adults and children with medical conditions or trauma injuries.

Students who complete the 12-hour on-line continuing education training option must also register and complete a 12-hour practical skills program to complete the 24-hour recertification requirement. There are no restrictions on the order of completion for these two requirements. MFRI is committed to scheduling sufficient 12-hour on-line modules and 12-hour practical skills programs to ensure that all providers have the opportunity to meet recertification requirements.

Minimum System Requirements: Participation in this training program requires access to a personal computer system with internet connectivity via a broadband or cable network connection. Software interface to the training modules requires Internet Explorer. An internal video and sound card with either speakers or headphones must be available for embedded videos.

Eligibility: Students are required to be members of a Maryland Fire Department and possess a current State of Maryland EMT-B certification. Students must complete the on-line portion of the program within 30 days of the start date. If a student drops from the course or fails to complete the course, a grade of DROP will be recorded on the student's MFRI transcript. Any student with a previously recorded DROP grade will not be permitted to repeat the on-line training course. *This course may not be used as a pre-requisite of the Maryland Application for Reciprocity process.*

Registration: There is no fee for this program. See our web site (www.mfri.org) for scheduling and registration. Registration closes two weeks prior to the class start date.
